Halloween Parade October 29th

On Halloween Day the students can bring their costumes to school and wear them in the afternoon. For safety purposes and with the varying ages in the school please do not send any "weapons" for example fake swords, knives, and guns. Students are asked to keep their faces showing so no scary masks. The parade will start around 1:00 in the gym if gathering limits allow but more likely it will be outside around the field.

Breakfast Program

A school breakfast program offers a balanced, delicious and nutritious start to the day. We have a breakfast cart for when the students arrive at school that they can go to the cart and choose two items. We also have dry items in a bin in each room in case your child is throughout the morning or has forgotten their recess snack. The program ensures that all students have access to the program. There may be days where your child needs a little extra breakfast because they didn't get a chance to eat before the bus, or were only able to grab something quick before leaving home. Nourish Nova Scotia supports breakfast programs across the province with grants to schools. We are fortunate again to have support for our program this year. It's important that all students have a good start to the day to help with their learning.

Inclement Weather Plan

Winter is close at hand and along with it come concerns of ice/snow storms and possible early dismissals. On rare occasions, schools may also be cancelled because of some type of mechanical/electrical failure. When this happens, we need to be sure that someone is home or

that the students have a place to go if you are not at home. You have received a form that needs to be filled in and returned to tell us who to contact and where your child will go in the event of an emergency or early dismissal. **No student** will be released without a parent, emergency contact or designate being contacted by phone.

In cases of early morning inclement weather, the HRCE will decide whether or not to cancel school and will announce on the local radio stations, the HRCE website (www.hrce.ns.ca) and through the school cancellation number (464- 4636) usually by 6:00 a.m. As well, you can be notified by email and/or text. Click the notification button on the HRCE website to register (www.hrce.ns.ca). We belong to the J.L. Ilsley Family of Schools. If school is cancelled for the J.L. Family, then Sambro is closed. If busses are not running but schools are open in the J.L. Family, then we are open for walkers and students driven to school. Listen carefully, as exceptions are also announced. For instance, they may say: All schools in the in the Halifax West Family of schools are closed today along with Sambro, Harrietsfield, etc. In this example, J.L. Family would be open with the exception of Sambro and Harrietsfield.

Occasionally, the school may be cancelled during the school day. In such cases, the HRCE will inform the schools by 11:00 a.m. Radio stations will also announce school closures. If you see that weather conditions are becoming more severe, then please listen to your radio for a possible announcement of a mid-day closure.

For generations, our ancestors have entered into treaties with other Nations in a long tradition of relationship-making. These relationships, based in ceremony and consensus, protected our ways of life and honoured reciprocity.

This year we will explore these concepts which highlight four major themes; Ceremony and Consensus, Peace and Friendship, Denial and Damage, and Renewal and Reconciliation.

Throughout the month we will be able to explore Mi'kmaw treaty-making, the Covenant Chain of Treaties, and important facts about key treaties and their protectors.

We are all responsible to the treaties, and without oral histories, there would be no treaty rights today.

During October, schools will hold special events to recognize this month, in addition to learning about and honouring Mi'kmaw culture throughout the year.

This month and throughout the year, we recognize the contributions of Mi'kmaw people to Nova Scotia and the importance of treaties as both the building blocks of Canada and living documents that affect everyone in Canada today.
