# School Safety

Your child's safety is the first priority of our school. All staff are diligent when on duty and throughout the building. Many of our staff are trained in CPR and first aid and some are trained in Non-Violent intervention. We put many things in place to ensure that your child feels safe at school. If at anytime your child says they do not feel safe please contact me immediately. If something happens at school where your child is hurt you will be called. There are times when kids play a little rougher than usual and may fall or get pushed. Staff and myself deal with those situations as close as possible to the time of the incident happening. Part of your child's education is learning how to play and respond appropriately to interactions with their peers. We use these opportunities to teach your child appropriate play and responses. Attached is a document of some of the things we do to keep your child safe at school.

## Lunch program:

The hot lunch program is up and running smoothly. The students get their lunches delivered to them and handed out by the teacher or lunch monitor. Trays are picked up by lunch moms. The students get 20 minutes for each with the primary students a little longer. Sometimes the quantities are a little too much for your child so please send along a container that we can send the leftovers in. In this way you get to see what your child likes and dislikes and makes for a little snack at the end of the day. Please sit down with your child and the menu to choose lunches together. We are sometimes finding a large portion of a child's lunch in a waste basket.

**Garbageless Lunch**: As part of protecting the environment we are asking if possible for you to send your child's snacks and lunches in reusuable containers to help us limit the garbage. One idea would be to buy the bulk size of gold fish or crackers etc and put some each day in a reusuable container.

We are the dead: Short days ago, We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved: and now we lie In Flanders fields!

Take up our quarrel with the foe
To you, from failing hands, we throw
The torch: be yours to hold it high
If ye break faith with us who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields
