The **Pre-primaries** are outside every day discovering and exploring their environment. Our **Primary/1 Gray** class just finished some interesting inquiry work around the theme of fall. Asking some deep questions about plants and chorophyll. On to Snow and Ice Inquiries. **Grade 1/2 Caines** did some cool STEM activities with vegetables and ramps. They created vegetable cars that can go down a ramp. There was a lot of cucumbers, potatoes and carrots being manipulated into vehicles. They also created a class logo with the help of Mr. Cocek our school technology facilitator.

Grade 2/3 Henneberry worked on personal narrative focusing on revising and editing. They are moving on to a poetry unit in writing and making connections and learning how to summarize. In Math they will be putting their estimating skills to work in math.
